



Freedom Trail — Dalai Lama's Historic Route

The second edition of the Freedom Trail commemorates the historic entry of the 14th Dalai Lama into India through Kenzamani in 1959, symbolising courage, faith and resilience. The six-day foot march retraces this significant route from Kenzamani to Tawang, culminating at Pungteng Tse.

The initiative goes beyond a physical journey, serving as a tribute to spiritual heritage, unity and the historical significance of the region. It reinforces the cultural and geopolitical importance of Arunachal Pradesh in India's modern history.
